The Board meets monthly, except in May and December, usually at Pistone's Italian Restaurant in Seven Corners, on the second Monday of each month.

The current Board would like to reduce the number of Executive Directors on the Board from seven to five, but to do so requires a change in the NVBA Constitution and Bylaws, and, therefore, NVBA membership approval of the proposed changes to the applicable Articles (see page 10 of this Newsletter). The process to obtain that approval is on-going as I type, and it takes quite a bit of work and a Special Meeting of the membership to accomplish (see page 1 of this Newsletter).

The Board is also proposing another change to the Constitution that would allow for voting by acclamation at the Annual Meeting instead of by ballot when no Board positions are contested that year. This change is subject to members' vote at the upcoming Special Meeting scheduled for April 28.

Board members are elected in two groups, and serve two years for each term. In odd years, such as 2005, the President, Secretary and three (or four under the existing Constitution) Executive Directors are up for election. The Executive Directors whose terms are up this year are: Pete Hughes, Ron Kral, Paul Krueger and Barry Sparks. Barry has decided not to run for a fourth term, but will remain active in volunteer jobs, and Pete has finished his two-year term and has also decided to not run again, but I am sure that Pete will continue to help out in other volunteer functions. Lucy McCoy, who has other responsibilities in District 6, has also decided not to run for a fourth term as Secretary, but will continue doing volunteer work for the NVBA in other capacities.

Kathryn Kiley (Chairperson) and Bob Hartmann are the Nominating Committee (NC) for this year's elections. The NC is charged in the Bylaws to "prepare a slate of officers and executive directors to be placed in nomination by it at the annual meeting of the members" (Please refer to the complete slate of candidates that are running for election on page 9 of this newsletter). The Bylaws further allow additional nominations to be made by any member who submits a petition signed by 20 NVBA members in good standing to the Nominating Committee or NVBA Secretary at least 14 days prior to the Annual Meeting to have his/her name placed on the

In the recent past, the NVBA has not had many contested elections. However, this year the NVBA is fortunate to have a few more folks competing for election than the minimum required to fill the slate. This surplus of qualified candidates speaks volumes to the growing enthusiasm and participation of our members in the current and future well-being and business of the NVBA - and that is exactly what this President and all of the current Board members hold as the most important goal to be pursued.

#### STOP! In The Name of The Law by Marshall Pearlman

he red STOP card: why do we have it in the bidding box?

There is probably no rule in duplicate bridge more commonly abused than that of ignoring the STOP card, which is to be used before making a skip bid (weak or strong). A skip bid is one that skips at least one level of bidding, as in 1♣ - 2♥. The skip-bid warning, accomplished by saying, "Skip bid, please wait," or by using the red STOP card, mandates that the opponent left of the making any call.

This simple procedure is there to protect players from giving unauthorized information. Yet so many of us pay little or no attention to its use. After a by the next player can give that player's partner unauthorized information. That is, a quick pass could show weakness, a quick double great strength. A long pause followed by pass or a minimum bid relays to partner that one has values but not enough for more aggressive action.

Such actions could be completely honest and innocent, but each puts a heavy ethical burden on partner, who is expected to bid solely on his own hand and not to base his call on his partner's quick pass, quick double or slow bid. In practice, this is very difficult to do.

"The 10-second period starts from the time the bid is made (verbal or bid card). A player should wait 10 seconds after any skip bid with or without a

Note carefully: the 10-second period starts when the bid is made, not when the warning is made and not when the STOP card is picked up. This delay reduces the possibility of "reading" partner's hand from the manner of his action. Use of the skip-bid warning is not required but we skip bidder wait ten seconds before highly recommend that you use it as a courtesy to your opponents and to avoid problems for your partner. Note that, if you use it, you must use it all the time for all skip bids, not just for certain kinds, e.g., weak bids.

skip bid has been made, a hasty action During the 10-second wait, avoid conveying information. As in other situations, you must sit quietly and impassively, and then make your call. Tapping your fingers, grabbing the Pass card and holding it for 10 seconds, or looking totally bored or impatient, violate the spirit of the regulation and defeat its purpose. So please comply with this simple, but, important rule.

> Say, "Skip bid" or use the STOP card whenever you make a skip bid. Wait 10 seconds after the bid whenever your opponent issues the skip-bid warning. It is the ethical and proper thing to do in fairness to your fellow players.

and 3) achieve consistency between NVBA Bylaws and longstanding policy. Your attendance is encouraged.

The proposed amendments to the Bylaws are as follows, with amended text in **bold italics**:

Article V, Section 1. Function and Number. The affairs of the Association shall be managed and conducted by the Board of Directors in furtherance of and accordance with this Constitution and Bylaws and other expressions of the will of the membership. The Board of Directors shall be comprised of the officers of the Association; i.e., the President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, and five (5) executive directors, all of whom must be members of the Association. The immediate Past President, when there is one, will be a non-elected member of said Board of Directors.

Article V, Section 2. Selection and Terms of Office. Except as provided in Article V, Section 5, "Vacancies," each officer and executive director shall be elected at large by the members at their annual meeting. The President, Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer shall each hold office for two years, or until his/her successor shall have been duly elected. The President, Secretary, and three (3) executive directors shall be elected in odd-numbered years, and the Vice President, Treasurer, and two (2) executive directors shall stand for election in even-numbered years.

Article V, Section 4. Elections. All ballots shall be secret. Each candidate is entitled to have a representative at the counting of votes.

- a. Each qualified member present shall be entitled to one vote for each officer and executive director to be elected.
- b. Absentee ballots for the election of Officers and Executive Directors shall be available to any member who, for whatever reason, is unable to attend the Annual Meeting.
- c. Applications for absentee ballots may be submitted to the Membership Secretary as early as one month prior to the election. Absentee ballots shall be mailed after the nomination period in Section 3, above, has closed.
- d. Absentee ballots must be returned by US Mail and must be received by the Membership Secretary prior to the commencement of the Annual Meeting.
- e. Absentee ballots shall be identical in character to those distributed at the Annual meeting so as to be indistinguishable therefrom. All ballots shall be counted together at the Annual Meeting.
- f. If the entire slate of officers and executive directors to be elected is uncontested, the Nominating Committee shall present the slate to the membership for approval by acclamation. If not, a written ballot listing all candidates is required.

Why a Special Meeting?? Amendments to the NVBA Constitution and Bylaws may only be made at the time of the Annual Meeting or at a special meeting of the membership called in accordance with Article IV, Section 3 of the Bylaws (the NVBA Constitution and Bylaws are posted on our web site at www.nvba.org - go to "About the Unit" and then click on "Constitution & Bylaws"). In order for such a special meeting to be held, it must be announced to the membership in writing at least ten days in advance. This notice serves as that written notification. It is the desire of the NVBA Board of Directors that the terms of the proposed amendments be in effect at the time of this year's Annual Meeting to be held on Thursday, May 12, 2005, at the Knights of Columbus Hall, 5115 Little Falls Road, Arlington, VA (see article on page 9 of this Newsletter for more details).

Although the NVBA Board anticipates a contested election this year for the open Executive Director positions, we would like to take this opportunity to change our Constitution and Bylaws to allow the membership to vote by acclamation at the Annual Meeting in those instances when there is only one candidate on the slate for each available position. 
