# President's Message

N 2007 THE BIGGEST challenge for the NVBA was the requirement to locate a suitable replacement venue for the four NVBA Sectionals. The first two Sectionals at the new Elks Lodge location on Route 50 are now in the books and the players have all indicated that the new location is much to their liking. Attendance was good and many favorable comments were received from players from both sides of the Potomac. I expect the same trend to continue in the February and April Sectionals of 2008. Every aspect of the Elks location is an improvement over the former location. The Sectional Tournament Co-Chairs, Margot Hennings and Kathryn Kiley, will continue

to refine the details so that the Elks location will provide the best–ever location for the NVBA Sectionals. And there is plenty of parking, to boot!!

Keeping the NVBA financially viable is our big challenge for 2008. The Sectionals are the main source of net income for the NVBA, and Sectional rent, even with the move to the Elks, increased about 35 percent. In addition, the Unit has sought to increase a number of member benefits, including a free Life Master/Non-Lifemaster game (a great success!), free play for any NVBA member with less than 5 master points, an annual Anniversary Party for the 199er Game, and a free membership Directory (printed in a flexible format with a joint NVBA/WBL version planned). Also, in 2007 the Unit had some major capital expenditures. We purchased a new PC and printer for the Unit Game (long overdue) and a duplicating machine to duplicate hands at the Unit and Sectional events (critical to the growth and management of the game). The NVBA has the resources to provide these benefits, and all of them have contributed to the quality of the NVBA bridge experience. In addition, attendance at both the Unit Game and the Sectionals has increased. That said, the combination of rising Sectional and Unit game costs in terms of rent and Director fees has to be addressed.

My goals as President include the use of NVBA resources to serve the playing membership, while maintaining adequate, but not excessive, reserves to weather any financial storm. Accordingly, the NVBA Board formed a Financial Committee (FC – Dale Dallaire, Margot Hennings and Herb Fallin, Jr.) to study and recommend an across-theboard set of options to reduce expenses and increase income. The FC has already made one presentation to the Board and several options to reduce expenses have been adopted. The Board will meet again and continue to adopt further expense reductions, while preserving those benefits that most effectively serve the membership. As we approach the end of the fiscal year (30 April 2008), the FC will have provided additional suggestions for the Board to adopt, the Sectional finances at the new Elks location will be better understood, the new lease at Beth El will be established for 2008-09 (terms and conditions have been settled and are excellent – formal signing is in process), and the Board will be able to best determine the financial plan for the coming year. After all the expense reductions have been adopted, it is likely that the Board will find it necessary to increase pricing in order to maintain and grow the quality of the

NVBA bridge environment. If any of you have suggestions with regard to financial issues, please feel free to send them to any member of the Board.

In Fall 2007, Suzanne Abrams succeeded me as the primary Bridge Advisor to the Thomas Jefferson High School Bridge Club (Thomas Jefferson HS was just cited by *U.S. News & World Report* as the best high school in the entire United States!). Nancy Cartwright and Bob Kerchner assist Suzanne in this vital activity. On a time available basis, I also support the TJHS Bridge Club and Suzanne's phenomenally successful bridge club at Garfield Elementary school. For its part, the NVBA continues to provide the crucial "bridge cookies" to these young and enthusiastic bridge players of tomorrow.

Players who are 19 and under should be aware that the ACBL has established the first North American Bridge Championship for Youth, which will be held in Atlanta, Georgia July 3-6, 2008 in conjunction with an Atlanta Sectional at the Hilton Atlanta Northeast Hotel, 5993 Peachtree Industrial Blvd, Norcross, GA 30092, Tel: 770-447-4747. Sponsors of the tournament are requesting that interested players pre-register for the event at <a href="https://www.youthnabc.org">www.youthnabc.org</a>. Information on the schedule and pre-registration is available on the Mid-Atlantic Bridge Conference website <a href="https://www.mabcbridge.org">www.mabcbridge.org</a>. The second running of this Championship event will be held in conjunction with the Summer NABC here in Washington, DC in July 2009.

In the last Newsletter, I mentioned a need to find the right person to serve as the Partnership Chair (PC) for the Unit Game. Traditionally, this responsibility has been staffed by one person, the PC for the Unit Game and Sectional tournaments. In my tenure as President, this has evolved (per force) into two separate positions, one for the Sectionals (Mary Ann Kral) and one for the Unit Game (myself). Herb Fallin and Ed Brawn have helped at both functions, as have other volunteers. What I would REALLY like to find is a principal for the Unit Game PC. This is a terrific job and one that I greatly enjoy. It does require that you can attend the Unit Game and that you enjoy working with matching up players. And the Winner is.....??

Looking ahead to the Annual Meeting and the 2008 election cycle, I want to challenge all of you to consider serving on the NVBA Board. The Board meets ten times a year and recent meetings have been held at the Board Room of Springfield Golf & Country Club or International Country Club – both lovely locations with great Board Rooms. In April 2008, the positions of Vice President and Treasurer and two Board Director positions are up for election. Any NVBA member in good standing is eligible to serve on the Board. #### The Jack of Hearts

F YOU ONLY WENT to one NABC in 2007, chances are it was San Francisco. And if you went, chances are even better that you weren't disappointed. What a beautiful city! The bay, the bridges, the cable cars, and so much more. Even the street names (Sutter, Kearny, etc.) evoke memories of the city's Gold Rush origins. Grab a latte and a seat by the water some morning. Listen to the gulls screeching and lines slapping against masts. Spend the day sightseeing but be sure to end up at an eastward-looking spot in the late afternoon (Twin Peaks, the Golden Gate bridge, Sausalito) and you'll be dazzled by the sight of the sun glittering off windows in the Eastbay hills. Diamonds in the dusk! And by evening,

of course, enjoy one of The City's numerous fine restaurants, many with magnificent views. In fact, the only "complaint" about San Francisco was that not enough of you did those things. So many of you spent your time playing bridge that it was difficult to make your way through the Marriott. Folks playing bridge in the hallways means business is good. They were and it was as 14,858.5 tables made San Francisco 2007 the third largest Fall national ever, behind Las Vegas (2001) and Orlando (1992).

We hadn't visited there since the last NABC eleven years ago which was entirely too long. While there, I also realized how long it had been since I had heard it referred to by the nickname, Baghdad by the Bay. A reflection of our world in the 21st century? What a pity. Detroit will host the 2008 Spring NABC. Sandwiched between San Francisco and Las Vegas, it rates to be tiny, which is too bad because those who have seen it rave about the playing venue. Which means we all should go since our chances of winning will improve. But neither early March in the Motor City nor 110 degrees in Vegas in August can compare with mid-sixties in San Francisco.

So, what did we have to show for all this bridge playing? Well, the biggest news was that Jeff Roman's win in a bracketed KO turned him Platinum as he went over

10,000 MPs. Helene Bauman was 8th in the LM Pairs for our only top ten NABC finish. National overalls also went to Sarah Cressy and Cecily Kohler (Women's Pairs), Margot and Don Hennings with Robbie Hopkins, and Ai-Tai Lo and Alan Schwartz, all in the Open BAM. In addition to Jeff, regional wins were recorded by, well, Jeff who also won an A/X Pairs, and Helene who also won a bracketed KO. I failed to win an event but I did the next best thing. I finished second in a compact KO playing with my son. It doesn't get much better than that.



### BRIDGE IN MEXICO

EVERY YEAR in October there is an ACBL regional in Puerto Vallarta, Mexico (hereinafter "PV" for brevity). PV is on the Pacific coast, west of Guadalajara. You may know of it from the movie "Night of the Iguana," which was filmed there. The tournament is held at the Fiesta Americana, one of PV's luxury hotels. Its facilities, including the playing area, were as good as at any regional or NABC that I have ever seen. And the hospitality! I had thought the snack table at the Outer Banks sectional, earlier in the month, was awesome, but the gala buffet lunch they put on for us in PV during the Sunday Swiss, included in the price of your entry, outdid even North Carolina.

My wife Linda and I had accommodations nearby, in a time-share owned by Mexican friends. We arrived late Thursday, 25 October, too late and too tired to play. However, we did stop by to say hello to resident director Guillermo Poplawsky. Guillermo (hereinafter "Gmo"), in case you don't know him, is a well-known ACBL director – a regular at the Gatlinburg Regional and at NABC's. He is a leading bridge personality not only in Mexico but, as a World Bridge Federation delegate, throughout the Western Hemisphere. I'm an unabashed admirer, and if that shows, let's just call it full disclosure.

Gmo – called "Memo" (the nickname for *Guillermo*) by his players – officiated with two others under Director in Charge Tom Whitesides. Only one of them besides Gmo spoke Spanish. The rest didn't need to, although one did manage to pick up the word for pencil, after helping a technologically challenged player with a mechanical sharpener.

As Linda and I looked around on Thursday night, who to my wandering eye should appear but the NVBA's very own Ed Lewis, partnered by his son Edwin III. Ed and Dot attend PV every year. They have a condo there.


On Friday we checked in with the partnership desk, ably manned by Steve Penning, one of the many Anglos who live at Lake Chapala, in or near the town of Ajijíc (ah hee HEEK), near Guadalajara. He found me an excellent partner, Lee Dorsey. Lee and I teamed up for the Friday/Saturday KO with two friends of his from Mexico City – Marylou Galindo and Lene López – with whose help we eked out a second place finish, losing in the final to a team headed by Assistant Tournament Chair Laraine Callom. On Sunday, with other teammates – Jorge Rosen and Mónica Schapira, also friends of Lee's – we finished third in B and first in C. Jorge and Mónica are originally from Buenos Aires (i.e. are *porteños*, like Mirta Halperin).

Linda hit the jackpot with a partner from Anchorage, Alaska, Janice Tingler. The two clicked instantly and had a fine time. They made dates to play online as soon as they got home. I had to get out my slide rule to calculate the time differential for them.

The majority in attendance at PV seem to have come from outside Mexico, including large contingents from Vancouver and Fresno. Jade Barrett, a Canadian expert and professional, gave chalk talks at the tournament. With his wife Karen Lee, another expert, he provided suitable competition for players of the Lewis's caliber.

ACBL Units 173 and 205, in District 16, are in Mexico, with a total membership of 260. In addition, Mexico has the *Federacion Mexicana de Bridge*, with about 400 members. The Federación belongs to the WBF (as does the ACBL). Most of its members feel no need to join the ACBL, but do play regularly in ACBL-sanctioned games. Thus Mexico has two parallel bridge communities, cordially coexisting, both of which were well represented at PV.

In addition to PV, Mexico has one other regional each year, in late February, at the resort-spa of Ixtapán de la Sal, not far from the capital. Mexico also holds two sectionals, one at Ajijíc and the other at San Miguel de Allende, both of which are Anglo enclaves. Weekly club games are held in Ajijíc, which is first in attendance. Mexico City is a close second; followed by San Miguel; Guadalajara; and Monterrey. Seasonal



activity occurs during winter months in the beach towns of Acapulco and Mazatlán. At Ajijíc and San Miguel, the regulars are English-speaking, whereas everywhere else, including the capital city, the regulars are Spanish-speakers. PV this year totaled 822 tables, up from last year's count of 599 by 37 percent, with 343 players earning 4673.47 masterpoints. Ed Lewis's teammate, Richard Potter, led the winners' list with 66.56. Ed and his son tied for eighth, with 52.48 each,

In the old days, before the Internet, duplicate players in Latin America had homegrown bidding systems such as Colombia's *La Biblia* (The Bible), during the 'sixties. That was an indigenous harbinger of 2-over-1. Nowadays though, I doubt you'd find things much different. At PV I certainly didn't. Of course, between rounds there were the usual debates about whether a double by overcaller's partner was support, or his jump to four in a new suit splinter. In short, bridge down there is much the same as up here.

If I saw any difference at all, it was that Mexican bridge is more social. In English that means their level of intensity is slightly less than ours. Which is to say, they have more fun. Everyone knows everyone else. Each new pair that Lee and I sat down with were old friends of his. The Barretts of course were an exception, when we drew them for a match in Swiss teams. Jade and Karen may have been *forasteros*, or visitors from afar, but we howdied with them nonetheless. It's what one does down there.

You wouldn't expect multilingual situations to pose a challenge for bridge's terse vocabulary. But as you go from one Latin American country to another, the names of the suits change. Spades in most places are *espadas*, or 'swords,' while in Colombia, Argentina and elsewhere they are pique (as in French). Diamonds are *diamantes* usually, but Argentina, once again, emulates French with *carró* for that suit. Clubs are *tréboles* (i.e. the three-ball pawnshop symbol) in half the Spanish-speaking world, including Mexico, and *flores* (or 'flowers') elsewhere. The only suit whose name does not change is hearts: corazones. Another word that stays the same is 'suit,' which is *palo*, or tree. Thus "the deck's four suits" is *los cuatro palos de la baraja*.

Playful variations sometimes occur on the compass points. While north and south are usually *norte* and *sur*, in Bogotá I once heard a player in his cups grandly announce a two-club contract by North as *dos tréboles septentrionales*. The rest of us exchanged glances, but understood. East and West, for their part, might be *el señor Oriente* and *doña Occidente*. The basic words, *este* and *oeste*, sound so much alike that – as with 'ace' and 'eight' in English – in a noisy game you could have to point with your finger. And instead of *occidente*, in Central America you might hear West given as *poniente*, an archaic word used in the Isthmus referring to where the sun sets.

Gmo regrets to say that Mexico is not doing enough to promote the game. I told him a little – boasted, really – about what-all we're doing in the NVBA toward that end. He approved, and stressed that the most important thing any unit can do, to build for the future, is bring along new directors – recruit, train and develop them. In his experience a good club director will attract more regular players to duplicate bridge than any amount of lessons.

That's food for thought. While you're at it, try to guess how many people we have in the NVBA who hold ACBL certificates as directors. Need a hint? Well, US\$12.20 will buy you that same number of Mexican pesos, at today's exchange rate of ten.


