Congratulations also to Stephen Drodge and Dan Emmons on winning the Rufus L. "Skinny" Miles Non-Life Master Pairs National event at the San Diego NABC. A pair of 18-year-old college students with about 300 masterpoints between them, they won the event going away. They scored 64.20 percent in the first session of the 13-table event and followed it with a 67.15 percent game in the evening session. Their average

Six months into the job of NVBA president, I'm struck by how much time it requires and how much work there is to do. Most of our membership (including yours truly before last May) has the luxury of taking Unit business for granted or of seeing the proverbial tip of the iceberg and thinking that's all there is to it. I don't think I'm wrong if I assert that volunteers spend upwards of 120 hours per week on NVBA business. That's work for a full-time staff of three people.

There are many opportunities to serve. Giving a few hours here and there can prevent someone else from feeling overworked. We have a terrific Unit game and can always use folks to bring food, help with drinks, arrange partnerships, and serve as guaranteed partners, just to name a few tasks.

If you have ideas on how to enhance the experience of bridge or to help the NVBA grow, you can help our Education Chair or serve on our Bridge Promotion Committee, to name two opportunities. Check out the ad for a Unit Archivist in this Newsletter—what a perfect job for someone interested in research and history!

Six months after you read this column, we will elect new officers and board members. The past couple of years the NVBA has been lucky to find only enough people to serve in those positions. There has been no competition of visions or priorities. Does everyone have the same views of the importance of offering bridge to youth? To retirees? Does the NVBA's checkbook reflect your priorities for growth versus putting on tournaments? In my experience, there is nothing like competition to make an organization vital and vibrant. The NVBA does not need to reflect the partisanship of our political system (and I hope it won't), but we do need to discuss different ideas and approaches.

Be part of an infusion of new talent and ideas. Run for a leadership position. Some of you will be my targets for arm-twisting and recruitment, but I might not find the people with the best new ideas. Expressing an interest in serving on the board is easy; just tell me or Alan Breed of your interest.

Part of getting involved is staying informed. Minutes of board meetings are now posted as soon as possible after each meeting without waiting for formal approval at the next meeting. Read them and you'll get an idea of what your unit leadership thinks is important.

When I first became a leader of an organization, I adopted two key tenets: Tell people what I believed was important and tell them where I was going to spend my time. That served me in good stead. My employees didn't always agree with me, but they were

never in doubt about my priorities. The NVBA has volunteers, not employees, but it is still useful to articulate my priorities in those terms.

What's important? Two issues: long-term promotion of the game and ensuring the NVBA is on a sound financial footing. The second is critical to the first. What income can we devote to growth and promotion of the game?

Where do I spend my time? This is a tough one. For the past six months, my calendar has not reflected my vision. The Unit game has taken an inordinate amount of time. My time has been consumed with actions of a less-than-visionary nature, like the room temperature being too cold or hot. For that reason, we are establishing the position of Unit Game Coordinator, who will be to the unit game what Margot Hennings is to sectional tournaments. More to come on that, but it is essential if I am to spend the remaining 18 months of my term trying to achieve my priorities.

Do you agree with me? Good. Do you disagree? Even better. Have a say in making Unit policy and setting Unit priorities. Stay informed and get involved.

In Memoriam

LAWRENCE J. LATTO

ACBL Life Master/NVBA player Larry Latto, 89, a lawyer who specialized in insurance law, died of cardio-pulmonary arrest November 8, 2009 at Virginia Hos-



pital Center. Larry was born in Brooklyn, N.Y. He graduated from City College and then served in the Navy as a radar officer in the Pacific during World War II. He graduated in 1948 from Colum-

bia University's law school, where he was editor-in-chief of the law review.

Larry went to work for Shea & Gardner in 1948, becoming a senior partner and chairman of the law firm's executive committee. The firm was bought in 2004 by Goodwin Procter LLP, and at the time of his death, Larry was counsel there.

Larry represented the Prudential Insurance Company of America and other insurance companies in their development of variable annuities and variable life insurance policies, and he helped shape the rules adopted by the Securities and Exchange Commission to regulate those financial instruments. In addition to insurance law, he worked on commercial litigation, lawyers' professional responsibilities and estate planning.

He was active in Arlington civic affairs as one of the original founders and a past chairman of Arlingtonians for a Better County. He fought for desegregation of local schools and good-government policies. He was chairman of the D.C. Bar's Judicial Evaluation Committee when the lawyers' group decided in 1986 to make its evaluations of local judges public.

"There is a right of the public to know what the public's business is," he said.

He was chairman of the D.C. Court of Appeals' Board on Professional Responsibility, the nonprofit Center for Law and Social Policy, the Human Relations Committee in Arlington and the Arlington Board of Zoning Appeals.

Larry loved classical music and Gilbert and Sullivan operettas as well as playing bridge and tennis. He also had a lifelong love of science and mathematics.

Survivors include his wife of 63 years, Roslyn Perluck Latto of Arlington; three sons, Douglas Latto of Acton, Mass., Harrison Latto of Portland, Ore., and Andrew Latto of Foxborough, Mass.; and four grandchildren.

ED DUFFY

Edward J. Duffy, 71, a retired information technology director at the Department of Housing and Urban Development, died of renal failure September 20, 2009 at Virginia Hospital Center in Arlington County. He was a member in good standing of the Northern Virginia Bridge Association and an ACBL Life Master. He organized bridge groups and handled much of the administration of those groups, tracking and publishing scores and standings.

Ed worked for the federal government the Washington area in 1980.

from the 1960s until 1990. He started with the Department of the Army, with assignments in South Korea and West Germany. He later joined the Department of Housing and Urban Development, where he stayed until retiring in 1990 as the information technology director in the payroll department.

Ed was born in Joliet, Ill., and graduated from the University of Illinois. He received a master's degree in systems analysis from the University of Southern California in the 1970s, and he moved to the Washington area in 1980.

Wanted: Unit Archivist

ave you ever thought about the history of the NVBA? How did it come about? I've heard it said the NVBA exists because there was a hard core of bridge players who did not want to integrate bridge games. Hard to believe today, isn't it? I don't know if it's true or not, but I bet there's a story there.

Before I quit bridge for 20 years to focus on work and family, I belonged to the NVBA. Then I never heard the story about how it was founded, and might not have believed it. To me, the unit was for the young and tournaments were a whole lot different than they are today. We played politically incorrect events like Men's and Women's Pairs and Mixed Pairs. Bridge was largely an excuse for partying, and the parties often spilled over into the game. Behavior that would result in discipline or arrest today was par for the course. Many of the game's local stars were far from the staid elder statesmen they are today! I'd say "Oh, to be young again," but I probably couldn't handle it.

We weren't all young and foolish then; we had our own elder statesmen. Today we have a tournament (NVBA February Sectional) named after one of them, Bill Poissant. Bill was our treasurer, and he seemed to have the final word on anything that had to do with money. The moniker "Poison Bill" came naturally. Made me chuckle last year when I heard someone ask who Bill was and why we named a tournament after him.

And last summer the NVBA paid to name an event at the NABC for Bette Dudka. Since Bette died only a couple of years ago, many of today's bridge players probably know who she was, unlike Bill. But they may not know the real Bette. She was a fine player who always had time for lesser mortals. In one Baltimore tournament, she asked me to partner her in Swiss Teams and I was honored. I think we did well, but what I remember is driving her back to Alexandria. Bette always dressed "to the nines," as they used to say, and she had four or five suitcases full of clothes that I had to pack into my tiny Opel GT, or should I say pack around Bette, since there was no luggage compartment. I don't think we could talk all the way back because there wasn't room for her to move or see. With my driving, maybe that was OK with her!

Everyone knows we have a Dave Murray Award given to someone who is known as "everyone's favorite partner." Dave was a real person and a fitting one to name such an award for. Did you know he wrote country music, too? This year we're starting an award named for the late Sara Goodwin. I hope we can leave a record so our successors in 2019 don't have to ask "Who was Sara Goodwin?"

Past NVBA President Leo Cardillo has half a dozen boxes of papers in his garage. I can't promise if there are any stories, incriminating or otherwise, there, but who knows? Should be fun to go through them and see. The unit needs someone to cull those papers and develop a historical record. There are papers to be organized, interviews to be done, stories to be told. Our archivist would organize what we have, attempt to complete the record, and write newsletter articles on the history of the NVBA.

Interested members should contact me at **bobboyd72@aol.com** or at a game. We'll get the board to approve and you can begin. I'll even give you an unexpurgated look at some of the characters in our past. Of course, I'll cast myself in a favorable light, but perhaps those documents will lead you to the truth!




