Wanted: Needed: Volunteers By Bob Boyd NVBA President



HAT AMAZED me most when I became NVBA president was how critical volunteers were and how many it took to run the Unit Game and tournaments.

When I was growing up, there was a saying, "Let George do it." The context for that was that there was a job to be done, but we didn't feel like doing it. As long as it wasn't us, we didn't care who did the job. The saying may have had its origin centuries ago when George Washington was the leader of last resort. Need a commander for the Continental Army? Or how about someone to be the first president?

Let George do it.

The NVBA has been living off the efforts of several Georges: George Cardillo, George Hennings, and George Kral, just to name a few without whom we would not have a functioning unit. There is danger when volunteer work becomes a sentence rather than a job. George moves on or burns out and no one else is prepared to step in. We have terms of office for our elected leadership, but not for the volunteers who are far more critical.

NVBA is responsible for the Regional in Reston in 2011. Our leadership team is in place, but we are going to need many, many volunteers to ensure everyone enjoys the tournament. Be prepared for committee chairs to begin asking you.

The Unit Game and Sectionals are going to need some new volunteers shortly. We need replacements for Ross and Marty Bley to handle drinks and supplies and for Stan Schenker as caddymaster. After the heavily-attended LM/NLM Game, we have to find a coordinator for parking if we want to stay on good terms with Temple Beth El. Of course, we always need help with food and guaranteed partners.

The mentoring program is extremely popular with our non-Life Masters, but there are too few Life Masters willing to participate. We are hoping to undertake an initiative with WBL to teach bridge to Wounded Warriors at Walter Reed Army Medical Center. That will take volunteers to teach, direct, and play. Mentoring and teaching bridge to wounded soldiers are especially important because they give everyone a chance to show not only that the game is worthwhile, but that bridge players as a group give back out of gratitude for what they have.

As president, I would like to challenge every NVBA member to reflect upon what the game of bridge means to you. Bridge is made possible only by volunteers. Are you doing your share? Please take the initiative and let me know where you can help.

Don't say "Let George do it." If you leave it up to George, one day you might just find the door locked and the lights out.

The Jack of Hearts

HE GRAND SIERRA RESORT (GSR) is a 27-story monolith, dominating the flat landscape east of Reno. All previous Reno nationals have been held here but when we last visited in 2004, it was a Hilton. Before that it was Bally's and even earlier, the MGM Grand. Most folks agreed that the change was not for the better. GSR bought the place about four years ago with plans to turn it into a family oriented venue. So they paid a gazillion bucks for the hotel, took down the Hilton logo and replaced it with their own, a stylized GSR. Now as all CSI fans know, GSR stands for gun shot residue. How family oriented can you get? What next?

The Wizards change their name back to the Bullets? Other than that, little had changed in Reno. The Sierras still loomed, Lake Tahoe still sparkled, and the dealers still drew to 21 with maddening regularity. One change was the attendance of 12,196.5 tables, a decline of almost 3,000 from last time. Don't know whether it's the economy, the venue, or what but this is the first Reno to fall below 13,800. History will be the final judge but the word on the street is that next time we visit Reno, we will be downtown at the Silver Legacy.

At a West Coast national, you wouldn't normally expect to see many faces from Northern Virginia and fewer still with their names in lights. In this case, you'd be mildly surprised. Alan Schwartz and Ai-Tai Lo opened the tournament with an 8th place finish in the Flight A NAP and followed that with an overall in the new Platinum Pairs. Others with national overalls included Gil Cohen (Silver Ribbon and Open Pairs), Cecily Kohler (Silver Ribbon), Steve Reed and Stephen Drodge (Red Ribbon), and Jeff Roman (Open Pairs). Regional wins were recorded by La Quitta Talbot and Herb Fallin, and the troika of Jim Shoenhard, Tony Robson, and David Jackson, all in KOs.

Attendance went the other direction at the April nationals in Gatlinburg. Last year's dip below 10,000 tables proved to be an aberration. Despite the size, things went very smoothly and the cavernous convention center didn't seem as full, probably due to the 150-table playing area upstairs which was used for midweek KOs. At any rate, the final count was 10,064. Now mind you, while Reno might have been disappointing, 12K is still a pretty big NABC. To compare the two, Reno averaged 1,102 tables per day while Gatlinburg averaged 1,438. Just think how Gatlinburg would stack up against a small National. Hard to beat Gatlinburg where the red buds bud, the Smokies smoke, and all the dealers do is start the bidding.

In Memoriam

ED GOFREED

I discovered the world of duplicate bridge in 1994. There were lots of novice players like me, so finding a partner at my level wasn't a problem. However, finding experienced partners and mentors was another matter. I met Ed in early 1995 through Lorraine Yarmowich and Jack Armstrong. Thus began a wonderful experience of playing 2-3 times a month over 15 years with one of the best players and teachers in Northern Virginia. Ed could be a gruff, irascible, and irreverent partner, but he was always well meaning. I always looked forward to my games with Ed as an opportunity to learn and expand my bridge game, and I was never disappointed with the experience.

Ed enjoyed telling stories, playing bridge, and taking care of animals. Having retired as a veterinarian after 35 years, he was always willing to offer expert advice to other players who came to him with questions about their pets.

Although Ed's health began to decline, he continued to play outstanding bridge, winning in the last game he played.

At his father's funeral, Howard Gofreed said, "Dad...had a great way with people, and was well liked and respected by just about everyone he met. He had a great wit, a realistic and upbeat personality, and a twinkle in his eye."


Hal was a skilled and disciplined


