ZERO TOLERANCE

I teach lots of beginners. When I ask them why they don't play duplicate, by far the most common answer I get is "duplicate players are SO rude and mean." Many of us have become toughened up and blasé about bad behavior at the table, and simply let it go over our heads. Many of us work very hard to get new people into the game, and it's often years before they will tentatively take their first step. If, after all that work, they have a bad experience early on, they often just quit and never come back. An example is a lady who took many years of lessons from both me and other teachers. She's a very intelligent and a well respected educator. She finally decided to try playing on Bridge Base Online (BBO). She picked up with someone and played two hands. They "yelled" at her and she just logged off. Her comment to me was "I'll never do THAT again!" Luckily, her mother dragged her off to play bridge face-to-face, and she ended up a regular player, but the game very nearly lost a budding new duplicate enthusiast.

If you haven't done so recently, do some self-introspection and examine your own behavior. Here's some do's and don'ts. Ask yourself, "Am I doing any of these things? How can I change for the better?" Here are a few concrete suggestions:

• SMILE at your partner and your opponents! I'm personally accused of not doing this. I'm intent and focused on the game, and many people take this as being unfriendly. I'm working on this. We handed out "Smile, your partner will play better" buttons at the recent Reston Regional. We have leftovers, and if you want one, ask Mary Ann or me, and we'll be happy to give you TWO, one for you AND one for your partner!

Bridge In Colombia

In April, 2015, my wife Linda and I took a 12-day trip to Colombia. I lived, worked, and played bridge there from 1965-1971, and until now had not been back. A month before the trip, I got in touch by email with the local bridge people, thinking they would prove useful contacts while we were there. They responded promptly and helped make our visit a memorable one.

Colombia's capital city Bogotá is 8,700 feet above sea level -- more than half again higher than Denver. The savannah of Bogotá is an expanse of tableland high in the Andes, nestled in clouds. Its climate is damp, chilly and rainy. But when the night sky is clear, you can go up into the mountains to where there's no glare from city lights, and see the stars ablaze in a velvet black sky. At this time of year the Southern Cross is just above the horizon.

It takes a day or two to get acclimated to the altitude and catch your breath. Your metabolism is readjusting. That process affects some people in odd ways, such as brief memory lapses. Once you're acclimated, though, there's one effect that everyone appreciates. You can eat as much as you like and your new metabolism won't let you gain weight. During this trip each of us lost five pounds, while most assuredly not stinting ourselves at mealtimes.

Colombia has always had bridge players and clubs. Back in my day I played from time to time in Bogotá, and regularly in Cali.

Colombia belongs to the World Bridge Federation (as does the ACBL). C.f. Mexico, which belongs to the WBF and the ACBL both.

In Bogotá there are at least two clubs with regular games: the Bogotá Country Club and El Club de Bridge Almirante Colón. Vera Rosembusz, President of the Colombian Bridge Federation, kindly put me in touch with this club, well in advance of our visit, so I could go there and play.

The club occupies the entire second floor of the Almirante Colón building, the rest being doctor's offices. It's next door to a hospital. (The building is named for Admiral Christopher Columbus (in Spanish: Cristóbal Colón -- the nation's namesake). Members join by invitation and pay dues. Not all members are bridge players. Some use it as a luncheon or supper club. In addition to member activities, the club earns income from special events such as business

meetings and receptions. In essemce, it's more like a West End club in London than what we know in the States as a bridge club. A day or two after we arrived, I played in a duplicate game there, partnered by one of the directors. (My wife didn't play, and spent the afternoon shopping.) Astonishingly, one player remembered me from half a century ago in Cali. She boasted that she was now 86 years old. After the game I tried to find her to ask for a game, but she had drawn the last sitout and was long gone.

A week later I played a second time there, with the club's president, Glenn Lawson, an American married to a Bogotana. Glenn, like me, used to work in insurance. Though he and I had never met (I left Colombia shortly before he arrived), we knew most of the same people back then and had much to gossip about.

Colombian bridge is influenced to some extent by Bridge Base Online. At club games they play Standard American or "dos sobre uno" (Two-Over-One). And they still play "la Biblia," the home-

grown system I recalled from years gone by. It's based on five-card majors, and dates from when Goren and four-card majors were still common. Everyone I asked acknowledged that their "Bible" had been a precursor of Two-Over-One and Precision, but no one would go so far as to say it was an ancestor.

I found etiquette at their bridge tables more relaxed, more cordial than we're used to. No one makes opening leads face down or asks for questions. Nor did I see any convention cards on display. On my lead out-of-turn, when I tried to put it out as a penalty card, the opponents said go ahead and pick it up, adding in English, "This is a friendly game." To be sure, these were only weekly club games; their sectionals and regionals may well not be be that casual.

I asked at length about rules and behavior, looking for differences between there and here. Their games are governed by the WBF's laws, of course, which are very similar to the ACBL's, if not verbatim. What does differ is the WBF's manner of addressing bad behavior, which the ACBL deals with in its Zero Tolerance policy. The WBF, instead of laying down policy, gives guidelines for what its National Bridge Organizations' (NBOs') policies should be.

In Colombia there doesn't seem to be much need for official rules in this regard. I asked three directors -- two in Bogotá and one in Cali -- how they dealt with squabbles at the table. Each laughed, and said that on those rare occasions all they had to do was take the miscreants aside and "talk to them."

Fifty years ago, behavior and discipline were enough of an issue that directors did not allow husbands and wives to partner each other. Things seem to have changed. My impression was that behavior at their bridge games today may even be better than ours in the ACBL.

To score games, in both Bogotá and Cali they use old desktop computers running Windows XP and the DOS version of ACBLscore software. They don't use Bridgemates. It's shuffle and play, with traveler slips for scoring and no hand records. But they tell me Medellín's bridge club does have electronic scoring.

Several other cities have bridge activity. Vera included me on her email of a flyer announcing a tournament in Bucaramanga, the center city of Colombia's petroleum industry (they're a petroleum exporter).

Clubs in Colombia play more rubber bridge than we do up here. In my day we played for a peso a point. Back then the peso was twenty to the dollar, or worth a nickel. Today it's around 2,300 the (Continued on page 9)

dollar, so the stake in a rubber bridge game might be 100 or 200 pesos a point.

Colombia's second city, Cali, styles itself as "la Sultana del Valle," referring to its hinterland, the agriculturally rich Cauca River Valley. At 3,200 feet above sea level, its climate is sultry and tropical, yet pleasant and springlike. Palm trees and flowering jacarandas sway softly in breezes perfumed with a hint of jasmine. As its sobriquet suggests, Cali radiates the charm of an exotic, seductive empress.


My bridge home-base in Colombia used to be the Club de Bridge Santiago de Cali. It's still there, 45 years later, but not in the same location. As before, it occupies a residential house with its floor space arranged for two or more games of 10-12 tables.

Elsa de Castillo, whom Vera introduced to me as Cali's bridge commissar, opened the door to a game there. As in Bogotá, there are at least two clubs. One of them plays at the Club Campestre (Country Club), where "social" (i.e. rubber) bridge is the norm. That's where a four-day national tournament will be in August of this year. Usually it's pairs only, but this year they've added team events. The Club Campestre has five-star hotel facilities, which is a great convenience, since the Club is somewhat distant from the hotels in downtown Cali. Elsa says she'd love to see lots of "forasteros," or visitors from afar, in attendance.

At the club in Bogotá, you're welcome to visit the snack table, but you don't have to. During play a waiter comes by each table taking orders. The menu is prepared in the kitchen by the club's staff. Typically it's hors d'oeuvres and baked sweets such as cookies, merengues, or a cake.

(Here's one big difference Anglo grocery shoppers would find in Colombia. There aren't many prepared foods to buy. If you want cookies, crackers, spreads and things of that sort, you make them yourself at home, from scratch. You won't find many such things in grocery stores-- only the ingredients.)

The snack I ordered was pan de bono -- biscuits made with flour from yucca rather than wheat, and some cheese baked in. That's a Colombian favorite of mine. Having it at the bridge table in Cali was a nostalgic ritual, taking me back half a lifetime.

- Playing North/South, greet people when they come to your table.
 A "good evening" starts the round on a positive note. "Welcome to Table 10" is a bit much for me, but goes over well with some folks.
- Do not give unsolicited lessons to the opponents OR your partner. I used to offer advice, but soon found out it offended people. I'm delighted to answer bridge questions, but only WHEN I'M ASKED. I no longer say anything to my partner at the table because for the most part, it only embarrasses them in public and makes them play worse not better. The time for discussion is AFTER the round or game is over.
- Don't admonish your partner or point out the opponents' mistakes.
 EVERYONE makes mistakes at the bridge table, and they are many and varied. No convention card? Ask about their agreements. Point out in a friendly way that they need to have a completed convention card on the table. Disagreement about tricks won? Calmly go over the hand card by card or call the director.
- When asking about a convention or the bidding, do so in a level, neutral tone of voice. Yes, you're entitled to the information. Yes, they may have missed an alert. Yes, you may call the director if you think you've been damaged. But using an angry or upsetting tone doesn't help or change the situation. It will get resolved. It's only a game and only one board. Take the opponent's errors calmly and in stride.
- Avoid sarcasm to your partner and the opponents. It hurts everyone's feelings, and it's an embarrassment and discomforting to all.

A final example. A pet peeve of mine is when someone turns over a bidding box, then picks it all up, dumps it on a table, picks up a fresh one and continues as if nothing has happened. I think to myself "Didn't your mother teach you to clean up your own messes?!" At the Reston Regional, I saw a brandnew I/N player do just that. I was momentarily annoyed, but realized he just didn't know better. We finished early and I went and picked up the box and cards. I took them back to his table and said, "Let me show you how to reassemble a bidding box." He was understanding and grateful to learn something new and will likely fix his own bidding boxes from this point on. My showing my annoyance would not have helped at all.
