Bridge in the Magic Kingdom. What could be better? Mickey and the gang were all there and in high spirits except for Mr. Duck who was bummed about suddenly becoming America's second most famous Donald. But to be honest, a lot could have been better. Our previous Orlando venue, it was said, lacked for in-house restaurants, which forced players to drive/cab to dinner. In fact, the restaurants were nearby and parking at the hotel was free. At the Swan & Dolphin, the host for the 2016 Fall NABC, there were lots of in-house dining options, but most were pricey. The offsite alternatives involved a longer, laborious drive and parking was not free. The byproduct of that was that the daytime players were leaving as the prime time players were returning from dinner. Since parking fees had to be collected as they left, gridlock resulted and the incoming cars were unable to enter. Of course, folks didn't know about this in advance and attendance was still down around 2000 tables. Of those who did attend, many vowed not to return if the venue was retained.

The playing areas were nicely appointed and well lit and climate control was adequate. Free orange juice was available and plentiful every day. Evening hospitality, on the other hand, was uneven. On at least two nights, the scheduled treat was replaced by ice cream sandwiches, and on some nights the players were greeted with, "Sorry, all gone." One night I was told by a hotel staffer that hospitality ended at 11:30, but on nights when there was an adequate supply, they were still serving well after midnight. Worst of all was the last day. In the regional Swiss, it was decided to have the B/C event break after the third round and the A/X after the fourth to relieve pressure on the snack bar. Problem was the B/C's devoured almost the entire allotment of food, and the A/X players were told no more would be forthcoming.

As you'd expect, while there were fewer NVBA players in Orlando than there were at the NABC in DC this summer, we still had some success. Ai-Tai Lo was 5th in the LM Pairs and Li Yiting won the Women's BAM. Others with national overalls were Ann Lindley & Al Duncker (Open BAM & Senior Mixed Pairs), Alan Schwartz (Blue Ribbon), Wayne Bardsley (Mini-Blue Ribbon), David Rodney & Rusty Krauss (10K Fast Pairs), and Monique Smith (Mixed Swiss).

My failure to appear on the above list can be attributed to my working most of the tournament. During my last session of 2016, I had my favorite ruling. I was called to a table where Dealer's partner had opened 1 Spade before anyone else had called. When 4th seat declined to accept the bid out of rotation, I informed the Dealer that she would be required to pass for the remainder of the auction.

"When CAN I bid?" she asked.

"On the next board," I replied.

"Can't I just tell her what I have?" she implored.

In an attempt at levity and sympathy I said, "Sorry, no. But you might try hand signals."

"Good!" she cried, and raised her middle finger.

The NVBA Website

Did you know?

That NVBA has a website with LOTS of valuable bridge information? If you have a smart phone or a computer, you should check it out. We were lucky and got in early in the internet revolution and snagged a short, sweet, easy to remember name: www.NVBA.org. In addition to my position as President of the Unit, I'm the webmaster for the site. Before I go any further, I'd like to recognize Joe Hertz for all his work as assistant webmaster.

When I took over the webmaster duties, I completely revamped the site. After having it online for about a year and collecting ideas and suggestions, Joe revamped it a second time and made it MUCH better. We took a look at many other ACBL unit sites around the country and tried to incorporate the best ideas into ours.

We've tried to make all information available with no more than two clicks from the main page. Here is a sampling of the information available:

- On the home page, there are current event announcements. For example, if the weather is bad, you can check to see if the Thursday night Unit Game will be open or closed. We post the current status there as soon as a decision is made.
- Upcoming tournaments are listed for NVBA and WBL sectionals, and for District 6 regionals. Links to both the schedules and flyers are provided. A yearly listing of all special events is available. You can click through to the ACBL "Find a tournament" page to find non-local tournament information.
- The results of the Thursday night Unit Game are clickable from the home page in three different formats: ACBL website, Common Game website and NVBA website. Try them all and see which one you like the best. The NVBA website has historical results back to 2011. The current listing has information about special events.
- It seems like every week there's something special going on at the Unit Game. The home page has links to the Open game schedule, the 199er game schedule and the newcomer schedule. Review it periodi-

cally so you make sure you play in the scheduled GNT and NAP qualifier games.

- You can find information about any club game in the NVBA area. Click on "Clubs" on the left of the home page to get a one-page matrix of all available games. From the matrix, you can click again to get a map to the game. Google maps is used so you can request driving directions. The table has click-throughs so you can find the director's email and phone number, see special events the director has posted to the ACBL website, and get game results.
- From the home page, you can go to a page which lists the NVBA awards history, and the current status of each ACBL contest (Unit and District Mini-McKenney, Ace of Clubs, etc.)
- You can view all of the NVBA newsletters online back to 2000.
- Click on "NVBA Board" to see all the officers and committee chairs, and how to contact them. One more click and you can get to the NVBA Board meeting minutes back to 2005.
- There are links for information on metro area bridge teachers and learning to play.
- If you click on "199ers" on the left side of the home page, that will take you to an area devoted to the NVBA's 199er and newcomer games.
- There is also a "ride sharing" link on the home page where you can ask for help getting a ride to or from the Thursday night Unit game.

Navigation tip: Wherever you are on the website, you can always click on the NVBA logo in the upper left corner to return to the home page!

Second navigation tip: When clicking on a link that takes you to another website, it's set up so most browsers open the link in a new tab. So, when you're done with the link, just close the tab to get back to the tab with the NVBA home page.
