From the President

Beth El versus Knights of Columbus Hall (KOCH) for Future Unit Games:

Shortly after becoming NVBA President, I attended a meeting in July 2017 at Beth EI with NVBA Board member George Parkins, Beth EI Executive Director Adam Wallach and Beth EI Board President Julienne Bramesco. We learned that because our Thursday night bridge game was drawing more than 120 players, it was deemed a "large" event, and Beth EI management was worried about the possible security threat to their building, their employ-

ees and us. For that reason, they had decided that we would need to pay for an off duty police officer to be present throughout the game, in line with their requirement for other similarly sized functions. We agreed that 5 hours was a reasonable amount of time for the police officer to be present. This would cost \$45.00 per hour for a total of \$225.00 per night, over and above the \$350.00 rent we already pay.

Coincidentally, the Unit Game was already going to be at KOCH for the month of August while Beth El refurbished the Social Hall. In view of the extra cost for going back to Beth El, we arranged to play at KOCH for the rest of 2017 AND for 2018. There were a few Thursday evenings in 2017 when KOCH was unavailable, and for those dates we were able to play at Beth El. To cover the security fee, we charged ALL players (including those with free plays, and 0-5 players who normally pay nothing) an additional \$2.00 over the regular entry fee. The Board also decided not to hold a game on November 16, during the Chesapeake Regional in Cambridge, MD, because historically we have a very low attendance on such dates.

Shortly after Thanksgiving, KOCH let us know that the venue would not be available to us on nine Thursday evenings in 2018. This put a different complexion on matters. Going back and forth between two locations is confusing for players and onerous for Jim Gerding and everyone else who helps run the games. Discussions among Board members led us to think that it might be better to see if we could return to Beth El in 2018, since the imposition of the \$2 security fee seemed to have no significant effect on attendance. After verifying that Beth El would indeed be open to our return, the Board decided at its Dec. 10 meeting to do just that.

So we will be back at Beth El for the whole of 2018, starting on Jan. 4 (yes, I know the Flyer for the WBL Sectional says we are at KOCH, but do you know HOW LONG AGO those flyers were printed????). The only possible date that might not be available is Sept. 20. Attendance at KOCH and Beth El has been pretty comparable over the past few months. Some people come to KOCH but not Beth El, and vice versa, but a solid contingent comes to both. Location aside, Beth El is clearly a better place to play bridge-more space, easier parking, better lighting, a kitchen that we can use.

This is how it will work: Each player at Beth El will be asked to pay \$2.00 over and

above the entry fee for the game: 0-5 MP players will pay \$2.00, 5 to 20 MP players will pay \$7.00, 0-199 MP players will pay \$10.00, and all other players will pay \$12.00 each week (\$13 for games when the game fee is higher). Our treasurer, Ann Atcheson, will track the collection of these security fees separately, and it we have enough to pay the security fee without collecting the extra \$2.00, that fee will be waived on that particular Thursday.

Masterpoints and How We Maximize Your Masterpoint Awards:

What goes into making a Unit game schedule? When I started playing bridge I never thought about how masterpoints were awarded and how sometimes I earned a lot and other times not so much. Granted, coming in first gets you more masterpoints than scratching at say 4th place, but the awards also depend on the type of game. At the club level master points are awarded at certain levels, depending on the type of game. At the unit level, the award rate is higher. For special games—North American Pairs, Grand National Team Swiss, Charity Pairs—run in either setting, the award can be higher still. And the more tables you have, the bigger the reward. For example, in Sectional Tournament at Clubs (STaC) games, you earn points at the club level or unit level, but a high game percentage can earn you MORE points in the overall results for the District!

Each year, club managers/directors and Unit managers/directors make up a schedule of games, including: Unit Championship Games, Upgraded Club Championships, Membership Games, Charity Fund, Junior Fund, Educational Fund, Grass Roots Fund, Club Appreciation Team or Pairs Games, NAP Qualifiers and GNT Qualifiers. All of these types of games earn you, the player more points when you scratch.

Now keep in mind 'we' don't have to put together such a complicated schedule. Who is WE? We are the people who make the schedules for both WBL and NVBA Unit games. We work hard to give you as many opportunities to earn extra points as we can.

In the Fall of 2017, I attended the scheduling meeting to set the joint NVBA/WBL Unit Game schedule for the first time. It consisted of the directors for both Unit games, NVBA Sectional Tournament Chair Margot Hennings, Doug Grove who is a retired ACBL Nationally Rated Director, who still likes to help out his Unit providing valuable support and insight), Ron Kral (he hosted the meeting at his house, THANKS RON!) the Presidents of Units 147 (WBL) and 218 (NVBA), and various other interested parties. Doug brought all the necessary materials: a blank schedule for 2018, a list of all the types of games a Unit could hold, the amount of points each type of game earns the players, a schedule of all the major regionals in our area (District 6, 7 and 4, plus some of the more popular ones in Florida that the snow birds attend), when the various NVBA and WBL sectionals are being held, major holidays, when the NABCs are and where, when the GNT and NAP finals are being held in District 6, and any other information he thought might be pertinent to the task at hand. We met as a whole group and decided when NAP and GNT qualifi-

ers would be held for each unit. Then we broke into two groups and decided what type of game would be held each Thursday the rest of the year. After this session we reconvened and shared our schedules with one another, tweaking and fine tuning dates and types of games. All this is done to schedule games that will enable you to earn the maximum amount of points possible when you scratch.

It took about 3 hours on a Saturday morning for 15 people to assemble a draft schedule. Unit Game Director Jim Gerding sent out the master schedule for both units, and again there were some revisions and adjustments. At last it was finalized, and hopefully you already have a copy in your hand, or in your purse, on your fridge under a magnet, or as a book mark on your desktop, so you know what type of game is being played at either Unit Game location on a particular night. Ron Kral and Don Berman have posted them on the respective Unit websites, and printed copies are available at each Unit Game. So please enjoy our efforts on your behalf, and the next time you scratch, remember we VOLUNTEERED our time to help give YOU more points.

Would you volunteer to help at the Unit game of your choice? If you would, please approach a Board member, the President of the unit you play in or email us. We can use help in many areas, both at the Unit Games and at the sectionals each unit runs, to include set up, take down, food prep, and carting items to and from Sectionals, otherwise known as 'schlepping.' Many years ago, maybe as far back as high school, I heard the height of conceit defined as a flea floating down the river in an aroused state yelling, "Open the drawbridge!" What brought this to mind was the headline on the opening day bulletin at the 2017 Fall North American Bridge Championships (NABC) in San Diego which read "Welcome to Paradise." Now don't get me wrong. I like San Diego. It's a nice town and the playing venue was magnificent, situated right on the bay overlooking Coronado Island and Point Loma. But Paradise might be a stretch. Paradise might best be reserved for next Fall when we visit Hawaii. But here's the real shame of it. San Diego put on a great tournament. We last visited in 2009, same season, same site. That one just missed 13,000 tables. The 2017 version was about 10% lower, continuing the downtrend.

If membership is down at all, it's certainly not down 10%. Folks just aren't going to Nationals like they used to. In fact, they're not going to tournaments like they used to. Also, consider the tremendous influx of international players attending NABCs for the past twenty years. What would attendance be without them?

The stalwarts who went certainly had a good time, but few locals were among them. Ai-Tai Lo led the short list of successes with a 10th in the Blue Ribbon and a scratch in the LM Pairs. The only others I found with national overalls were Betty Bursey and Marsha Brown (0-5000 Blue Ribbon) and Robbie Hopkins (Mixed Swiss). Surely we'll do better next Spring at the NABC in Philadelphia, which is just two hours up I-95 and a long, long way from Paradise.
