NVBA 2018 Annual Meeting

The Northern Virginia Bridge Association will hold its annual meeting on Thursday, May 10, 2018 at the Beth El Hebrew Congregation, 3830 Seminary Road, Alexandria, Virginia. We will start at 5:30 pm with a catered meal that will include vegetarian options (free for ACBL members; \$10 for non-members). President Marty Bley will deliver the "State of the Unit" report, followed by a report from the Treasurer on the Unit finances. The President will recognize this year's new Life Masters and give out the 2017 ACBL Mini-McKenney and Ace of Clubs awards for the Unit (see page 10 for the top three finishers in each category). She will also present the trophies for NVBA Man and Woman of the Year, the Rush Buckley Award, and the NVBA Rookie of the Year trophy. The official business of the meeting includes election of five NVBA members to fill the vacant positions on the Board. Personal statements from the five candidates standing for open positions are on page 4.

From the President

Many exciting events are coming our way! A WBL Sectional runs from April 5-8 and our NVBA sectional is April 25-29. The NVBA Annual Meeting is on May 10, the Life Master/Non-Life Master Game is on May 31, the Longest Day is on June 21, and our 4th of July Regional is in Reston this year from July 2-9. Before bringing you up to date on these events, I would like to address the declining attendance of A/X players at the Thursday night Unit Game.

For quite a number of years the A/X section of our Unit game was a great place to play bridge; many very good and excellent players frequented our game. While these years were passing, the NVBA Board focused on attracting more players in the beginning and intermediate

stages of bridge, with the implementation of the 0-199 game (where I started) and most recently the 0-20 game. Players have moved up from these two games into the B/C game, but B/C players are not advancing so eagerly into the A/X section, and the A/X game has gotten steadily smaller. When I first went into the 'big' room, the A/X game was 10 tables at its smallest, but was usually 15 tables or more. Over the course of the last 10 months, it has been as small as 3 tables. Last week there were 9 tables, and that was the largest game in recent memory. A frustrating situation for all concerned.

Many factors have contributed to the decrease of the A/X field. Over the years, a number of A/X players have moved away or passed away, and some no longer come out at night, preferring to play only during the day. Some have lost their regular Thursday night partner, a few have stopped coming to the NVBA game and instead go to the WBL game, and others are snowbirds or "Mid-West" birds and are only here during the nice weather.

Bob Boyd, Carol Crawford, Susan Miskura and Steve Reed have volunteered to form a committee to investigate this situation, find solutions, and recommend them to the Board. If they contact YOU, please give them your time and attention. They hope to have findings and recommendations by the June 2018 Board meeting. We wish them well in their endeavors and look forward to a more vibrant and larger A/X game in NVBA land!

The flyers for the two sectionals mentioned above are around at various clubs and the Unit game, and are on pages 15 and 16 of this newsletter. We hope you will play at one or both as time allows. The NVBA Annual Meeting, on May 10 at Beth El, will begin at 5:30 with a dinner of Mexican food from Picante in Chantilly, arranged by David Loken! Thanks David! There will be cake with the names of the players who achieved Life Master rank in 2017—and strawberries! Additionally, the awards for NVBA Man of the Year, Woman of the Year, Rookie of the Year and the Rush Buckley Award will be presented. Don't know what these awards are? Go to the NVBA website, scroll down to the bottom of the home page and click on "Unit Awards—Current Standings and History." There you will find explanations for each NVBA award and a list of recipients for each year. Also at the Annual Meeting there will be electrons to fill five Board slots. We have four current Board members who have agreed to serve another term, and one former Board member who has agreed to return. Francesca Mazarella has decided to not continue with the Board. We wish her well; she worked hard on many tasks, particularly to introduce new players to the 0-199 game and recognize the progress of players in that game. We are better for her efforts. I know she will continue to support us even though she

isn't serving on the Board proper. Ann Atcheson will continue as our Treasurer; she is a Most Excellent Money Manager! Georgette Weiss took over as Vice President for Leo Cardillo, when he was diagnosed with a brain tumor, and has agreed to continue on the Board in the VP position doing a variety of tasks. David Lindley has also agreed to continue on the Board. He is the sender of the weekly emails you receive, he produces the Newsletter and is working on developing a brochure about the NVBA. Kevin O'Brien has also "re-upped" as a Board member. Kevin created the 0-20 game, which he manages, and was one of the key organizers of the recent First Annual Leo Cardillo-8 is Enough Team Game. Joe Hertz, who shares NVBA webmaster duties with Ron Kral, will be joining us again on the Board. He brings his many computer/tech skills to us as well as his leadership in helping to organize and implement the LM/NLM Game and the most recent Leo Cardillo-8 is Enough Team Game. If anyone else is interested in serving on the Board, please let me know. Otherwise, we will elect these candidates by acclamation at the Annual Meeting.

The LM/NLM game is scheduled for May 31, 2018. Soon you will hear and see information about how to sign up for this event. If possible, please sign up ahead of time! If you are a Life Master, you will be paired with a Non-Life Master and of course vice versa. You will be given ample time before the game to talk about a convention card. It is a fun evening and always well attended! We hope you will join us! Please stay tuned for when and where to sign up!

The Longest Day this year is Thursday, June 21, so it falls on the day of the Unit Game. NVBA plans to support the ACBL's efforts to raise money for the Alzheimer's Association by running a "Longest Day" game that evening. We are working on the details so please mark your calendar and stay tuned for further information! Several club managers will also run "Longest Day" charity games that week. You will find an ad listing Longest Day games and providing information on how to support Bridge Heroes on p. 18 of this newsletter.

The Reston Regional begins July 2 at the Reston Town Center. Look online or at club and sectional tournament games for flyers with the schedule and information to make a reservation at the hotel. There are also information flyers available to explain the parking situation, and the three methods by which you can pay for parking: calling a number on a phone, using the RTC parking app on a smart phone, or paying at a kiosk at the garage. There is no charge for the first hour you are there and no charge for parking after 5 pm, and hotel guests, of course, park for free. Depending on when you choose to play, parking will not be all that expensive, especially if you carpool and split the cost. If you play games starting at 2 pm, the cost should not exceed \$8.00. If you play morning games, it will cost you more. Parking will be free on the July 4th holiday and on the following Saturday and Sunday. At the tournament there will be two receptions for Intermediate/Newcomer players, one on Tuesday and one on Friday. On Sunday for the Swiss, there will be lunch for all as part of the hospitality for the tournament. We hope you will all come out!

2017-18 Grand National Teams —There is still time!

There is still time to get to your local club or unit game to qualify to win a partially subsidized trip to the **Summer 2017 NABC** in ATLANTA, GEORGIA. If you win, you will represent District 6 in the national finals of this grassroots competition.

The club/unit game qualification period began on September 1, 2017 and will end on May 5, 2018. To qualify, you play as often as you want and with whomever you want. As long as whatever team you play on wins at least 50% of its matches during a qualifying game, then you are eligible. You can form the team you want to play on in the District Finals from among all eligible players in your bracket.

The competition contains four brackets. In the Open bracket all players may enter. Bracket A (0-6000) has already played its first weekend competition. Bracket B is limited to players with 0-2500 masterpoints. Bracket C is limited to Non-Life Masters with fewer than 500 masterpoints. Masterpoint eligibility is determined by the August 6, 2017 ACBL list of points. At the District level competition, the match awards are red and the overall awards are gold. (Bracket C awards 25% gold and 75% red.)

April 14-15 is the first weekend of the District finals of Brackets B and C at one northern site (Margaret Schweinhaut Senior Center, Silver Spring, MD) and one southern site (The English Inn, Charlottesville, VA). The Open competition is only held at the northern site. You must pre-register to play. Pre-registration ends Midnight on Thursday, April 5, 2018.

Team captains must submit a check or money order for \$100 made out to District Six with the names and ACBL numbers of all players, email address for the Captain, the level of Bracket you are playing in, and your choice of the northern or southern site (if you are playing in Bracket B or Bracket C). This covers 2 sessions (one day) of play. Checks for preregistration may be submitted to the GNT Coordinator at the Southern site, Nan Massie, or may be sent to Lynn Jones 10 Tenby Court, Timonium, MD 21093.
