Director/Bridge Player Hat Thoughts!

I recently sent the following message to many of the players who frequent my club games. I have changed it a little but not too much. Slow play and unauthorized information are two of the gray hair-making facts of life for directors and players.

Slow Play

Two very good articles in the ACBL Bridge Bulletins in June and July of 2018 on pages 36 (June) and 29 (July) deal with slow play. I recommend you read them both. If you don't still have them in hard copy, you can access them online by logging into your ACBL account and click on the bridge bulletin link on the left and then go to the Archives. Find the relevant issue of the Bulletin and click on the "contents" link to locate the article.

Unauthorized Information

As a player, I HATE to hear from the table behind me, "How many points did you have?" "Oh, I had 12." "Who had the king of spades?" "I did." "You know if your opening lead is the ace of clubs, I don't make it". For heaven's sake, I will be playing that board NEXT! According to the Laws of Duplicate Bridge I should call the director immediately and report what I heard about that board! The director has the right to give my partner and me as well as the EW pair who are coming to my table to play that board an average plus and to give the "talkers" an average minus for Unauthorized Information transfer to another player's ears!

As a director, too, I hate to hear any discussion of the board just played. All it is doing is keeping your focus from the next hand. You cannot change the result by knowing who had what! You can look at the hand record AFTER the game to understand better what you should have done.

Give the organizers credit, though. They had the foresight to give away umbrellas as registration gifts. And the Marriott Marquis turned out to be a fine venue; its only flaw was its location one block down a steep hill from Peachtree St. where we played the last two times we visited. Hal Hindman and Sumner Steinfeldt were 6th in the Senior Swiss, and Annie and Alan Schwartz were 5th in the Mixed BAM. David and Avril Rodney were 6th in the 10K Mixed Swiss, one spot ahead of Li Yiting. National overalls also went to Ai-Tai Lo (LM Pairs), Li Yiting (LM Pairs), Ryan Connors (0-6000 LM Pairs and Wernher Open Pairs), David and Avril Rodney (0-6000 LM Pairs), and Robbie Hopkins (Open Swiss). None of the above, however, was our leading point-winner. That honor went to Hal Jones, who edged my former students, Ann Atcheson and George Parkins, by .07 MPs.

The Fall National this year is in Honolulu and we're hoping for better weather but, just in case, we recommend bringing your Atlanta umbrellas. Aloha, y'all.

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Putting on my bridge teacher hat, let me be clear that I am all for learning and extending our knowledge of bridge and growing as a player. But consistently talking about any hand after it has been played, while at the table, whether the result was good or bad does many things: it wastes time, it distracts you and your opponents from recording the score promptly, and it may well distract everyone from playing the next hand effectively.

The directors and managers of the vast majority of games in NVBA land provide hand records and post the scores and results in such a fashion that you can see what everyone else has done on any hand. This is done as a service to help you learn and grow—but after the game, not during it!

Back to the director/player hat! Aside from wasting time giving unauthorized information to other players, talking about the boards after they are played is unattractive in other ways: If it is a good board for you then you are gloating; if it is a bad board then you are whining; and endless discussion or “instruction” from one player to another can be tedious for the opponents and may be construed as unwarranted criticism—a Zero Tolerance offence. Please take a moment to review the relevant parts of Law 16, given below, that pertain to unauthorized information. (You can find Law 16 in full on the ACBL website.) Part A deals with Authorized Information, Part B Deals with Unauthorized. Note the BOLD and underlined parts! I’ve also included Law 90, which deals with offenses that are subject to Procedural Penalties. See part B, items 2, 3 and 4 in particular.

Law 16 Authorized and Unauthorized Information

A. Players’ Use of Information

1. A player may use information in the auction or play if:

- (a) it derives from the legal calls and plays of the current board (including illegal calls and plays that are accepted) and is unaffected by unauthorized information from another source; or
- (b) it is authorized information from a withdrawn action (see C); or
- (c) it is information specified in any law or regulation to be authorized or, when not otherwise specified, arising from the legal procedures authorized in these laws and in regulations (but see B1 following); or
- (d) it is information that the player possessed before he took his hand from the board (Law 7B) and the Laws do not preclude his use of this information.

2. Players may also take account of their estimate of their own score, of the traits of their opponents, and any requirement of the tournament regulations.

B. Extraneous Information from Partner

1. Any extraneous information from partner that might suggest a call or play is unauthorized. This includes remarks, questions, replies to questions, unexpected alerts or failures to alert, unmistakable hesitation, unwonted speed, special emphasis, tone, gesture, movement or mannerism.

(a) A player may not choose a call or play that is demonstrably suggested over another by unauthorized information if the other call or play is a logical alternative.

(b) A logical alternative is an action that a significant proportion of the class of players in question, using the methods of the partnership, would seriously consider, and some might select.

2. When a player considers that an opponent has made such information available and that damage could well result he may announce, unless prohibited by the Regulating Authority (which may require that the Director be called), that he reserves the right to summon the Director later (the opponents should summon the Director immediately if they dispute the fact that unauthorized information might have been conveyed).

3. When a player has substantial reason to believe that an opponent who had a logical alternative has chosen an action suggested by such information, he should summon the Director when play ends. The Director shall assign an adjusted score (see Law 12C1) if he considers that an infraction of law has resulted in an advantage for the offender

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C. Information from Withdrawn Calls and Plays

When a call or play has been withdrawn as these laws provide:

1. For a non-offending side, all information arising from a withdrawn action is authorized, whether the action be its own or its opponents'.
2. For an offending side, information arising from its own withdrawn action and from withdrawn actions of the non-offending side is unauthorized. A player of an offending side may not choose a call or play that is demonstrably suggested over another by unauthorized information if the other call or play is a logical alternative.
3. The Director shall assign an adjusted score (see Law 12C1) if he considers that a violation of C2 has damaged the non-offending side.

D. Extraneous Information from Other Sources

1. When a player accidentally receives extraneous information about a board he is playing or has yet to play, as by looking at the wrong hand; by overhearing calls, results or remarks; by seeing cards at another table; or by seeing a card belonging to another player at his own table before the auction begins (see also Law 13A), the Director should be notified forthwith, preferably by the recipient of the information.

2. If the Director considers that the information would likely interfere with normal play he may, before any call has been made:

- (a) adjust the players' positions at the table, if the type of contest and scoring permit, so that the player with information about one hand will hold that hand;
- (b) if the form of competition allows of it order the board redealt for those contestants;
- (c) allow completion of the play of the board standing ready to award an adjusted score if he judges that the extraneous information affected the result;
- (d) award an adjusted score (for team play see Law 86B).

3. If such extraneous information is received after the first call in the auction has been made and before completion of the play of the board the Director proceeds as in 2(c) or 2(d) above.

Law 90 Procedural Penalties

Director's Authority

The Director, in addition to implementing the rectifications in these Laws, may also assess procedural penalties for ANY offense that unduly delays or obstructs the game, inconveniences other contestants, violates correct procedure, or requires the award of an adjusted score.

Offenses Subject to Procedural Penalty

1. The following are examples of offenses subject to procedural penalty (but the offenses are not LIMITED to these):
2. Arrival of a contestant after the specified starting time.
3. Unduly slow play by a contestant.
4. Discussion of the bidding, play or result of a board, which may be overheard at another table.
5. Unauthorized comparison of scores with another contestant.
6. Touching or handling cards belonging to another player (see Law 7).
7. Placing one or more cards in an incorrect pocket of the board.
8. Errors in procedure (such as failure to count cards in one's hand, playing the wrong board, etc) that require an adjusted score for any contestant.
9. Failure to comply promptly with tournament regulations or with instructions of the Director.

To summarize, it is my job when wearing my director hat to keep the game moving. I inform you when you should be playing your LAST board (usually you have seven minutes left) AND I tell you when you have two minutes left: *Good time to claim!* When you start discussing 'coulda, woulda, shoulda' situations, three minutes later there is still discussion because everyone has to have their 45 seconds to add their two cents. That's three three minutes of clock time that should have been used on the next board. Additionally, when called to the table as a playing director, I have to IGNORE any information I see/hear/learn about a board,

In Memoriam



Martha Ann Boyd, known to and cherished by many of the local bridge players, passed away on 13 August 2018 with family and friends by her side. She is survived by her loving husband of 34 years, Bob Boyd, her son Ben Jones of Colorado Springs, daughter Amy Jones of Herndon, VA, stepdaughter Ellen Boyd of New Castle, PA, stepdaughter Christine Miller (Michael) of Boulder Creek, CA, five grandchildren, and one great-grandchild. She was preceded in death by her sister Angie Robertson (Jack) of Columbia, SC in 2011. Martha Ann was born to B. Thomas Morgan and his wife Louise P. Burnett on 11 August 1934 in Lynchburg, VA. She graduated from E. C. Glass High School in Lynchburg and in 1956 graduated from James Madison University with a B.S. in Education.

She taught elementary school in Alexandria before taking time to raise her family. In 1975, Martha Ann returned to work in marketing and sales, retiring in 1996. She was a Life Master in the American Contract Bridge League and leaves behind many friends. Because of illness, she had to stop playing bridge a few years ago, finishing just shy of 2500 masterpoints. Martha Ann and Bob had a successful partnership in the early 80s before both stopped playing to work. They resumed playing in 2005 after Bob retired. Even given the thrill of tournaments, her favorite events were party team games with friends.

Martha Ann is remembered best for her warm and welcoming smile, always greeting newcomers as well as old friends with the same cheerful spirit and more often than not a funny story. Martha Ann was a great joke teller and a delightful person to have at a party or playing bridge. She was a loyal and faithful friend of many of us. She will be missed very much.

Her funeral was Saturday, 1 September, at St. Andrew and St. Margaret Church in Alexandria, VA. There will be a private interment later at Arlington National Cemetery.

If not, we should make a note on our scoresheet to discuss that board LATER.

Bottom line? We are ALL smart enough and competent enough to remember what the problem was with Board 12 without telling the whole room about it during in round 4!
