

## **NVBA Annual Meeting**

**Beth El**

**May 11, 2023**

**6:30 pm**

- President Georgette Weiss called the meeting to order and welcomed attendees.
- The minutes from the 2022 Annual Meeting were unanimously approved.
- The treasurer, Ann Atcheson, presented an overview of the financials for the year ending December 31, 2022. The unit sustained a net loss of -\$7,894 compared to a net gain of \$7,774 in 2021. The unit continues to lose money on F2F games. In 2022, we sustained a loss of -\$6,830. The BBO online games produced a profit of \$3,961. The Sectionals in May and September 2022 had a loss of -\$5,588. This year 2023, the two Sectionals in May and September created a profit of \$2,639. In 2022, the unit lost an average of \$800 monthly. In the first four months of 2023, the unit has sustained an average loss of \$1000 monthly. The board will reassess the Unit's finances in June and determine if it is fiscally responsible to continue with the Face-to-Face unit games. The NVBA unit has a cash balance of \$97,399 as of April 2023. The treasurer's report was unanimously approved.
- President Weiss presented certificates for the Ace of Clubs and the mini McKenney awards to the winners. Individual and group photographs were taken by Ron Kral to be posted in the newsletter.
- President Weiss presented the following slate of officers for 2023-24. They were unanimously approved:

- Joe Hertz gave a presentation and urged participation in the Life Master/Non-Life Master game scheduled for June 1 at Beth El. He furnished instructions on how to sign up to participate. The link will be posted on the website and listed in the upcoming newsletter.
- Kevin O'Brien presented an update on the Longest Day event to be held June 18-15, 2023. The NVBA game will be held on June 22 in person at Beth El, with online games June 24-25 and other games at local units during the 8 days, June 18-25. NVBA has participated for 11 consecutive years. Carrie Myatt, Senior Manager of the National Capital Area Alzheimer's Association thanks each NVBA member for their continued support and participation. She presented a beautiful plaque to the unit for their generous donations and gave a brief update on the strides that are being made to fight the disease.
- There was no new business.
- The meeting was adjourned at 6:53 pm.
